India's airline fleet, airport capacity to likely double in 3-4 years: Scindia

According to Jyotiraditya Scindia India is set to double its commercial fleet and airport capacity in metro cities in the next three to four years. "There will come a time in India, in the not-too-distant future, the

next three years, four years, where our fleet capacity will grow from the



current 720 to almost 1,500 aircraft. There will come a time in India, in the not-too-distant future, where if you look at our metro capacities today, which are at roughly 221 million passengers that will grow to about 400 million passengers," he said.

Rajasthan mulls unified Smart Card for entry into tourist sites

The Rajasthan government is working on implementing a system that will provide



tourists with access to multiple monuments and transportation facilities through a single smart card. The plan involves developing a portal by

the Department of Information Technology, with the Department of Tourism as the nodal agency and the Transport Department also participating. Initially, tourists will be able to visit multiple monuments using a single smart card that can be recharged.

UK Visa fee to go up by 5-7%

The fees and health surcharge paid towards the UK's state-funded National Health Service (NHS) by visa applicants from around the world, including Indians, are set to rise "significantly" to meet the country's

public sector wage increase, Prime Minister Rishi Sunak has said.

Sunak confirmed a hike between 5 and 7 per cent across the board.



However, he stressed that this would not be met with higher government borrowing for fear of further stoking high inflation and therefore the costs would need to be found elsewhere.
