India, Canada discuss expansion of air services pact



India and Canada have discussed the expansion of the bilateral air service agreement that will allow more flights between the two countries.

Union Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia, who is on a nine-day visit to the

US and Canada, met Canadian Transport Minister Omar Alghabra. Alghabra said he had a productive meeting with Scindia regarding issues of mutual importance to Canada and India. "We spoke about expanding the Air Transport Agreement that will allow more flights between the two countries," he mentioned. He said he was looking forward to more conversations to open up travel between the two countries, including flights to Amritsar.

MoCA allows GMR to operate Hyderabad airport till 2068

GMR Hyderabad International Airport Limited has received permission to operate Hyderabad's Rajiv Gandhi International Airport for a further period

of 30 years. In a statement, the company confirmed the receipt of a letter of confirmation from the Ministry



of Civil Aviation (MoCA) extending the term of the December 20, 2004, concession agreement for operating the airport for a further period from March 23, 2038, up to March 22, 2068.

Delhi beats Dubai to emerge as world's second **busiest airport in March**



The Delhi airport was world's second busiest airport in March in terms of domestic and international flights handled, said Official Airline Guide (OAG) in its recent report.

"Whilst Atlanta retains its position as largest, Dubai is knocked out of second place this month (March) by Delhi which moves up from third place last month (February)," the OAG's report mentioned.

The Delhi airport was on 23rd place in March 2019 before the pandemic, it added. In March this year, airports in Atlanta in the US, Delhi in India and Dubai in the UAE handled 4.42 million, 3.61 million and 3.55 million seats, it mentioned.

Air Arabia Abu Dhabi to start **Mumbai operations from May 12**

Air Arabia Abu Dhabi will soon add Mumbai as the sixth Indian destination in its network. The airline will start flight operations to Mumbai from May 12

onwards. Flights will be available on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays onboard an Airbus A320. "Mumbai is the city of dreams and is famously known for



its unique experience, magnificent architecture and savoury cuisine. It is the city of aspirations, wealth and glamour, a city which every traveller must visit," the airline said in a statement.

The flight schedule is as follows:

– Flight 3L 101 – Departing from Abu Dhabi at 15:00, arriving in Mumbai at 19:40.

Flight 3L 102 - Departing from Mumbai at 20:30, arriving in Abu Dhabi at 22:00.

Assam Cabinet approves budget for boosting tourism potential of Brahmaputra

The Assam Cabinet has approved the contract for construction of Terminal & Riverine Infrastructure at Guwahati Gateway Ghat; which will integrate connectivity and safe communication in ferry ghats of Guwahati & North Guwahati along with boosting tourism potential of the Brahmaputra. The total contract value is INR 289.45 crores.

Besides, the Assam Inland Waterways Company Limited (AIWCL) – a fullyowned state government will be constituted. The mandate of this company

includes – establishment, maintaining and operating cost-effective water transportation services within Assam, including river cruises; developing & maintaining all-weather ports, jetties, passenger terminals, etc.
