Mumbai-Kolhapur direct flights

Star Air, the aviation arm of Sanjay Ghodawat Group, has launched direct flights between Mumbai and Kolhapur under the Regional Connectivity Scheme.

Star Air will operate thrice a week between Mumbai and Kolhapur on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays to begin with, and expand the frequency to a daily service depending on the passenger response.

Palace on Wheels resumes operations after pandemic

Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot flagged off the 'Palace on Wheels' at Gandhinagar Railway Station, over two years after the luxury tourist train had suspended operations in the wake of Covid.
